The north bay has two side by side one over one double hung wrap around window units on the corners. A single one over one double hung window is centered in the bay. The second and third floors are typical of the first floor except for a concrete panel above the third floor window. The central bay has a door in the center of the bay. There are decorative concrete panels above the doorway on the second and third floors. The brickwork in the center section steps back approximately one brick thickness per course on each of the three outside courses. There is a single one over one double hung window in the furthest stepped back façade. There are the same type of windows directly above these windows on the second and third floors. The south bay is a mirror image of the north bay. The roof is flat and there are stone cornice cap along the entire cornice.

The first floor has a door with a transom The second floor has an off centered typical arched window. There is a rear gabled addition with a two story porch.
