T. This house is significant in the context of the several masonry houses along and adjacent to Haseltine Road built by or for members of the Haseltine family.

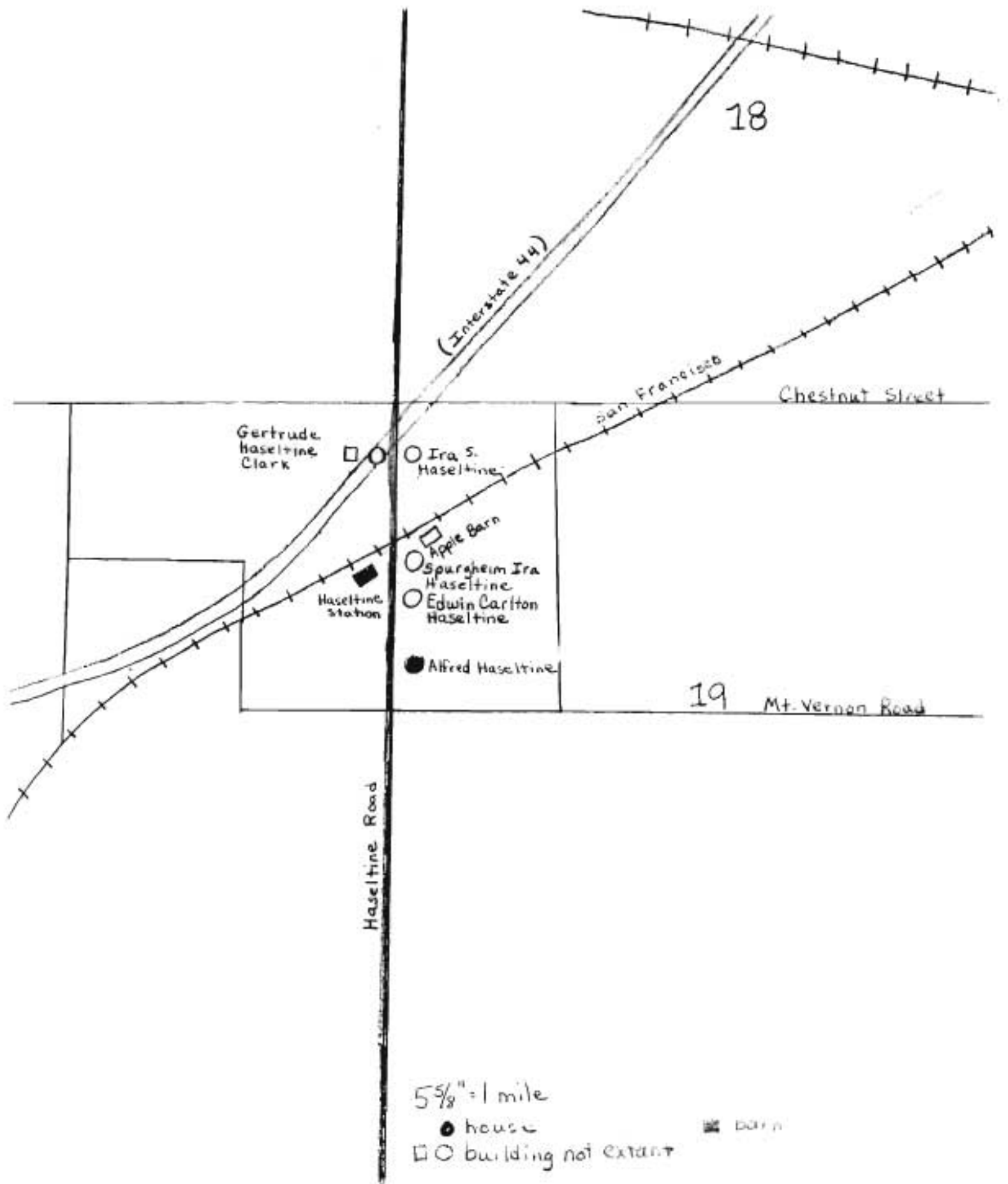
The Alfred Haseltine house is the third of three houses along the east side of Haseltine Road at Haseltine Station, proceeding south from the railroad tracks. This first was the home of Spurgheim Ira Haseltine (not extant; see site map and old photo). The second was the home of Edwin Ira Haseltine, first son of Spurzheim (not extant; see site map and old photo). Alfred was Spurgheim's second son, and his house was the third in the row.

The Alfred Haseltine house is of rubblestone laid in forms, possessing an intentional rusticated appearance quite unlike those of his elder brother and father to the north of him. Though dates of none of the three are ascertained, Alfred's style suggests a generational shift in taste toward the twentieth century and away from the old-fashioned vernacular classicism of the earlier two.

Ancillary structures: These include a stone pump house and well house. While both are rubblestone, the mortaring is different from the house and suggests much later construction.

Integrity: All structures are pristine.

SIGNIFICANCE This structure is significant in the context of the Haseltine family commercial apple business in approximately the last thirty years of the nineteenth century and the first thirty years of the twentieth century. It is one of six known Haseltine stone apple barns, the remains of five of which are extant. The Shipping Shed was one of two at Haseltine Station adjacent to the Frisco tracks. The other was across Haseltine Road to the east, is totally disappeared, its stones having been removed for building purposes.

T. Built in 1919, this is perhaps the latest of the Haseltine historic houses to be constructed.

Kirk Graber Haseltine, born 1898, was the son of Sumner Charles Haseltine and Elizabeth Kirchgraber. His mother was daughter of Joseph Kirchgraber, a prominent German immigrant farmer-orchardist-market gardner. Kirk Graber was not alone among the Haseltines to carry the Kirchgraber name: a cousin was named Joseph Kirkgraber Haseltine.

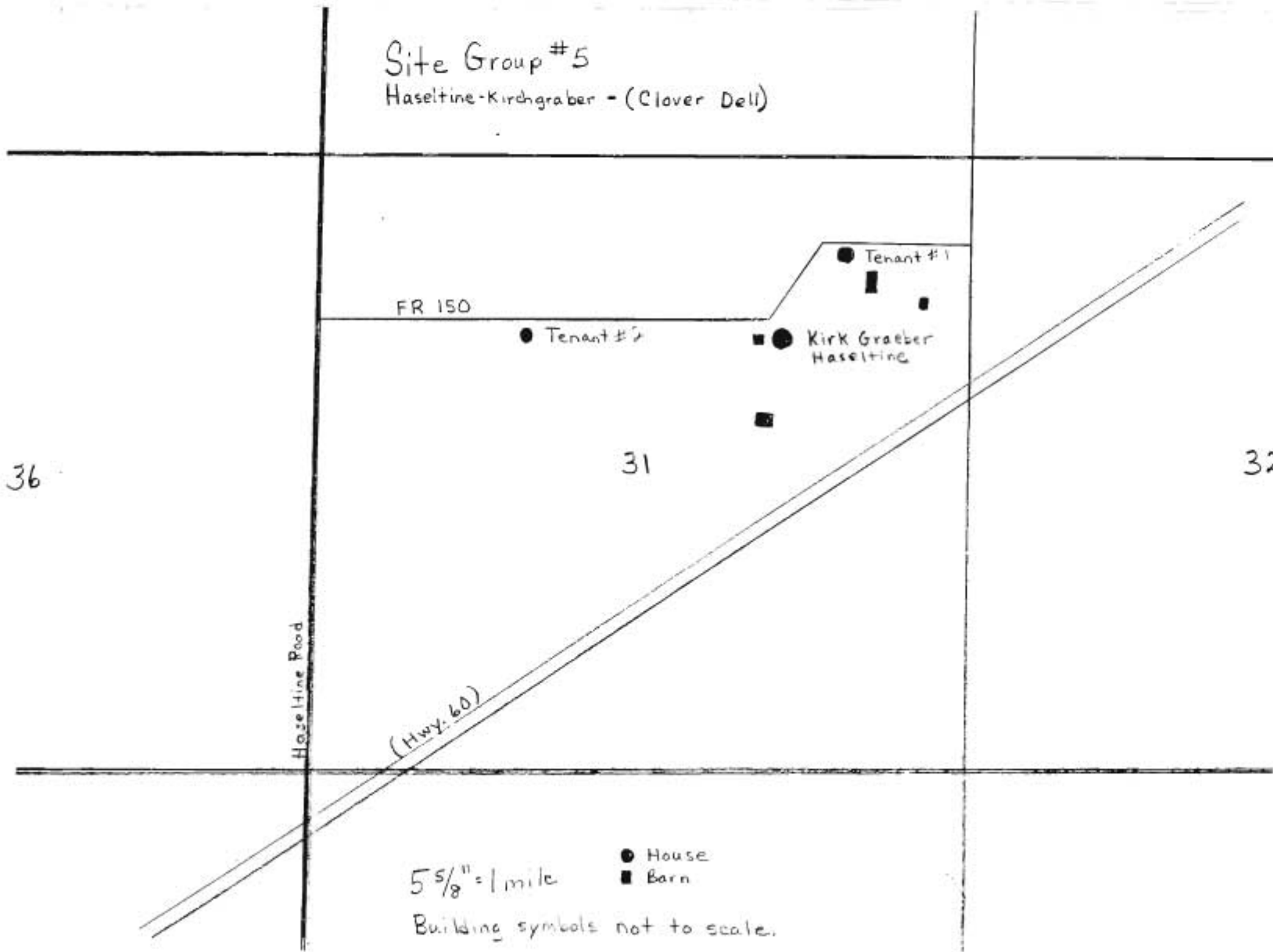
The orchard fam, "Clover Dell," where the K.G. Haseltine home is sited was the property of his parents, who did not reside there. (They lived next to the bride's parents on Fort Street in west Springfield, in a house which was the Kirchgrabers' wedding gift to Elizabeth and Sumner Charles. The S.C. Haseltine residence was three miles east and a mile north of Clover Dell Farm.) Kirk, the eldest child, managed the farm and built the house surveyed here when he was 21.

The house is of rubblestone construction in which the walls were laid up in forms. However, the stonework is intentionally artful, and together with other details, gives a Craftsman character to the building. Those details include faux exposed rafters in the boxed soffit, heavy, slightly battered porch pillars, and massive end chimneys. A Period Revival cast comes from classical details: formal symmetry exterior design, a formal central bay porch with pedimented gable, and six-one-one window sash.

The house possessed central heating from an oil furnace, a pressure water system, and electricity, perhaps from a generator -- all advanced features for a rural Greene County residence of the time.

2.Y. The house fronts on a lane, now closed, which provided access. It was surrounded by lawns and gardens, a pride of Mrs. K.G. Haseltine. Ancillary structures are a garage of matching stone construction, and a gardening shed. Outside the grounds, the house was surrounded on all sides by orchards. The brush and orchard fire of 1953 spared the house, both because the grounds provided a buffer, and because fire fighters arrived in time to give further protection.

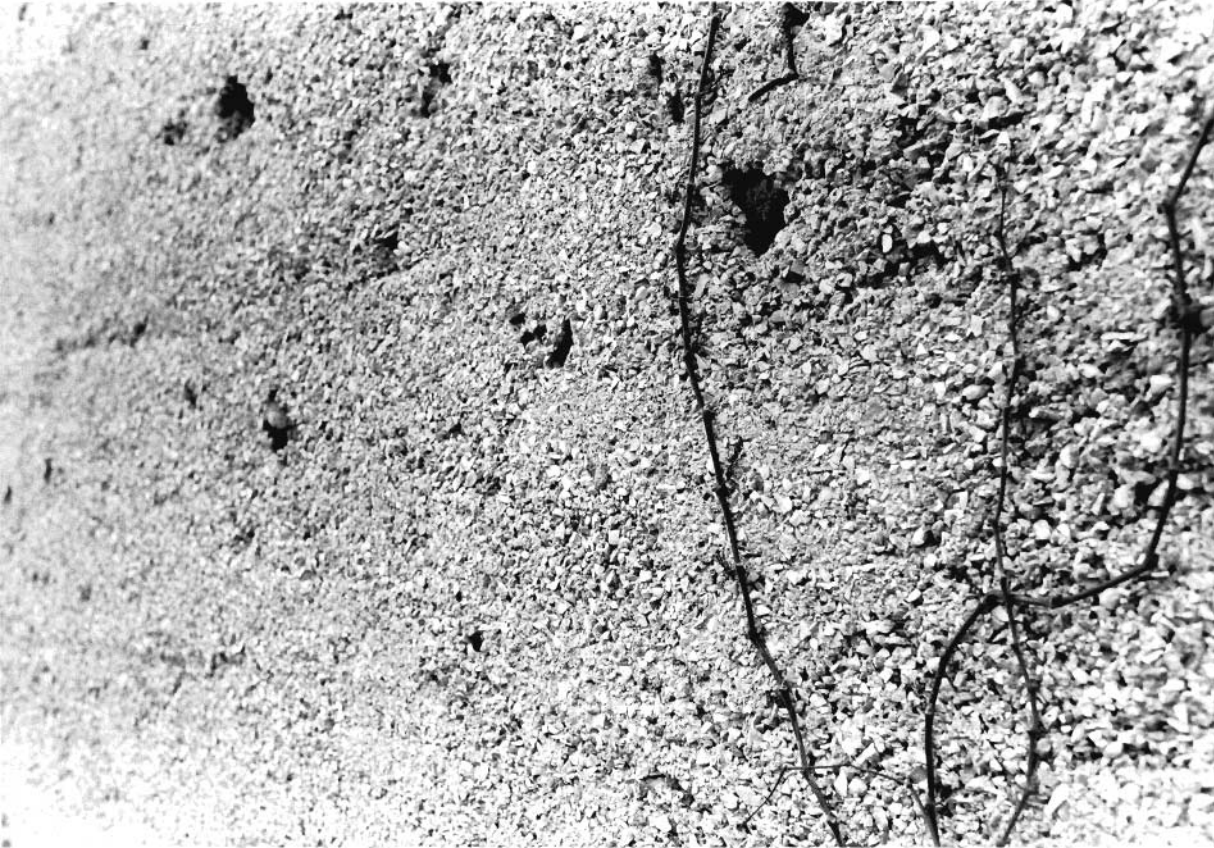

T. This house is significant in the context of the several masonry houses along and adjacent to Haseltine Road built by or for members of the Haseltine family.

This baronial house is unique among the historic Haseltine houses in its size, opulence, expression of architectural style and fashion -- and, doubtless, its cost. By inference it may be regarded more as the expression of its master, Adolphus Dreyfus, than of its mistress, Rosa Haseltine Dreyfus.

Of Adolphus, we know only that he was born in New York and lived in Kansas City prior to his marriage to Rosa. He was 31 years old and she was 24 at the time of their marriage in 1892. The date ascribed to the house is 1897; the 1900 manuscript census lists it as owned free of mortgage.

The house would fit well among the mansions of the North Benton Boulevard neighborhood of northeast Kansas City. The chief impression it conveys is a massing and detailing in the Late Queen Anne style with classical revival overtones, clothed in jagged limestone laid up in the manner of exaggerated rustication.

In fashion, pretension, and cost it far exceeded the other Haseltine houses, suggesting, in effect, that it was not a Haseltine house. Undisputably, though, it was erected on orchard lands owned by Rosa Haseltine, the wife.

Ancillary structures: At the rear of the house and separated from it by some 50 yards is a stone water tower and barn. The tower is one of four associated with Haseltine dwellings. This tower alone retains its tank, a cylinder mounted horizontally on a cradle. The barn is reputed to have been the site of vinegar distillation.

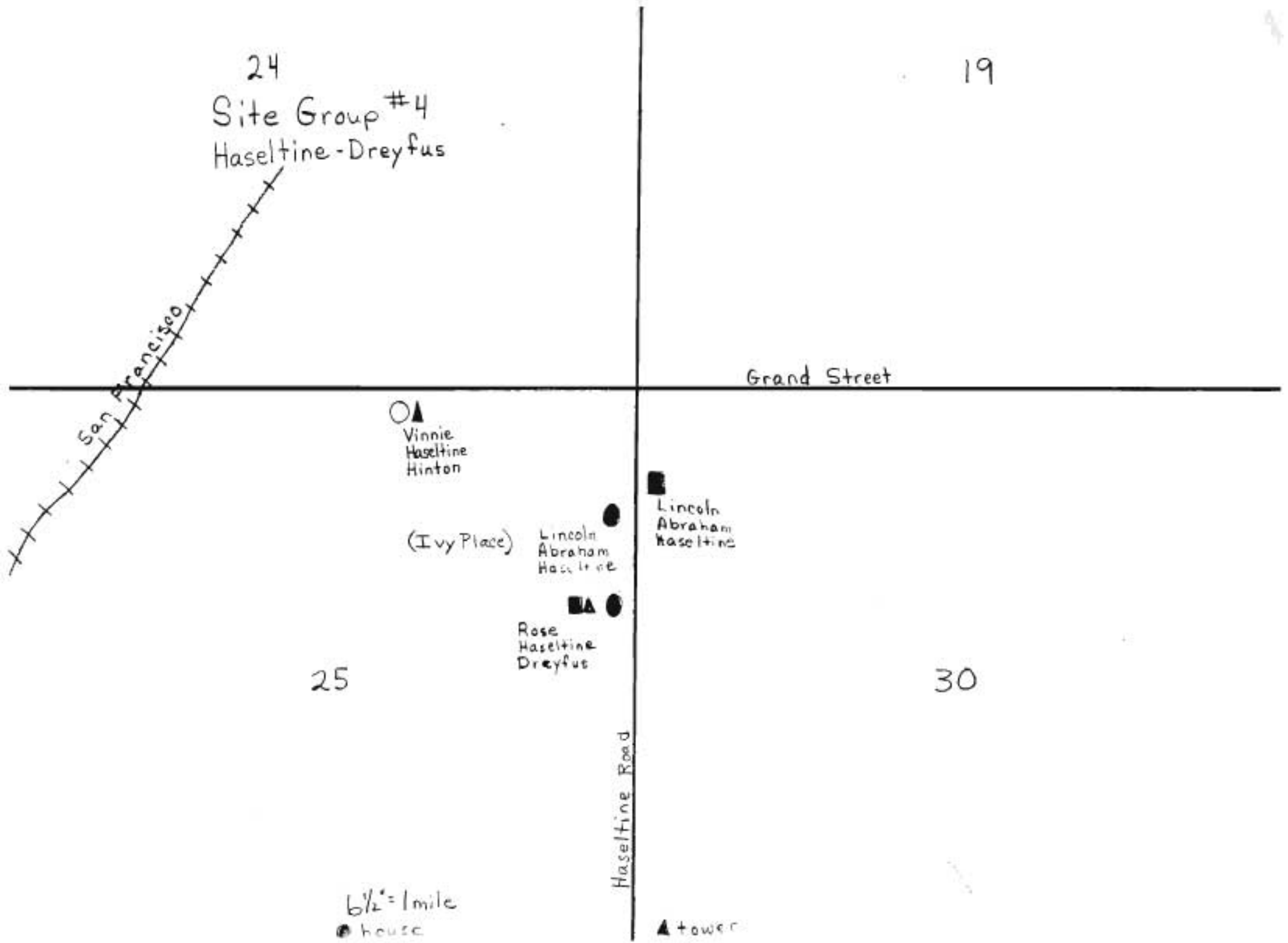
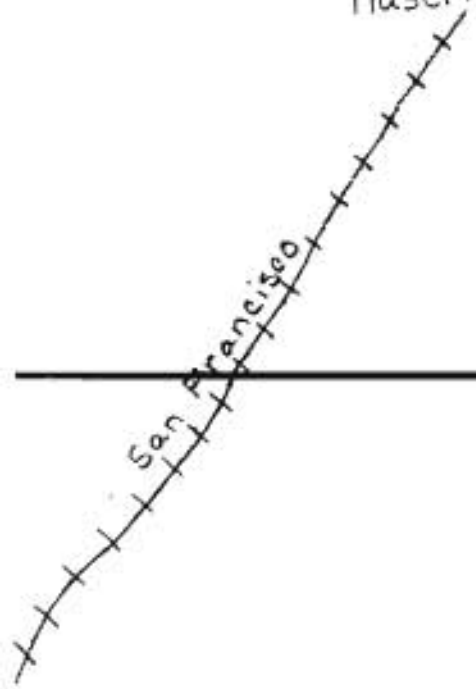

T. This house is significant in the context of the several masonry houses along and adjacent to Haseltine Road built by or for members of the Haseltine family.

The Lincoln Haseltine house is unique stylistically and structurally among the historic Haseltine houses. Though of masonry like the rest, it is brick rather than stone. Like the Louis Kossuth Sr. house (Lincoln's elder brother by fifteen years) it sits on a concrete pedestal which provides the floor of a wrap-around porch; and like Kossuth had decorative masonry porch pillars that may have supported a pergola (now gone). Otherwise it is quite different -- larger, more elaborate, in massing after the Queen Anne styles, but in detailing suggestive of the Spanish Mission style: smooth plastered and white-washed walls, engaged corner half pilasters of rusticated stone, and a large, recessed portico behind an arched opening with an exposed brick corbel in the arch.

2.X. The house is set well back from the west side of Haseltine Road and a little more than two miles south of Haseltine Station. It has handsome lawns sloping down to the road, as well as at the north sloping down to a draw, and behind reaching back to what is at present pasture land. In the past, it would have been orchard.

This commodious house, with its wide-spreading, seven-pillared wrap-around front porch, bell-cast roofline, and long, bowered approach lane suggests taste and substance on the part of its owner. He was a person whose residence was set in the midst of an immense apple orchard, and who possessed the largest of the Haseltine apple barns, located not far from his house. Louis Kossuth Sr. alone among the nine children of Ira Sherwin Haseltine received a bequest of orchard land from his father at the latter's death in 1899. The bequest carried the condition that Kossuth pay his aging mother \$120.00 per annum while she lived.

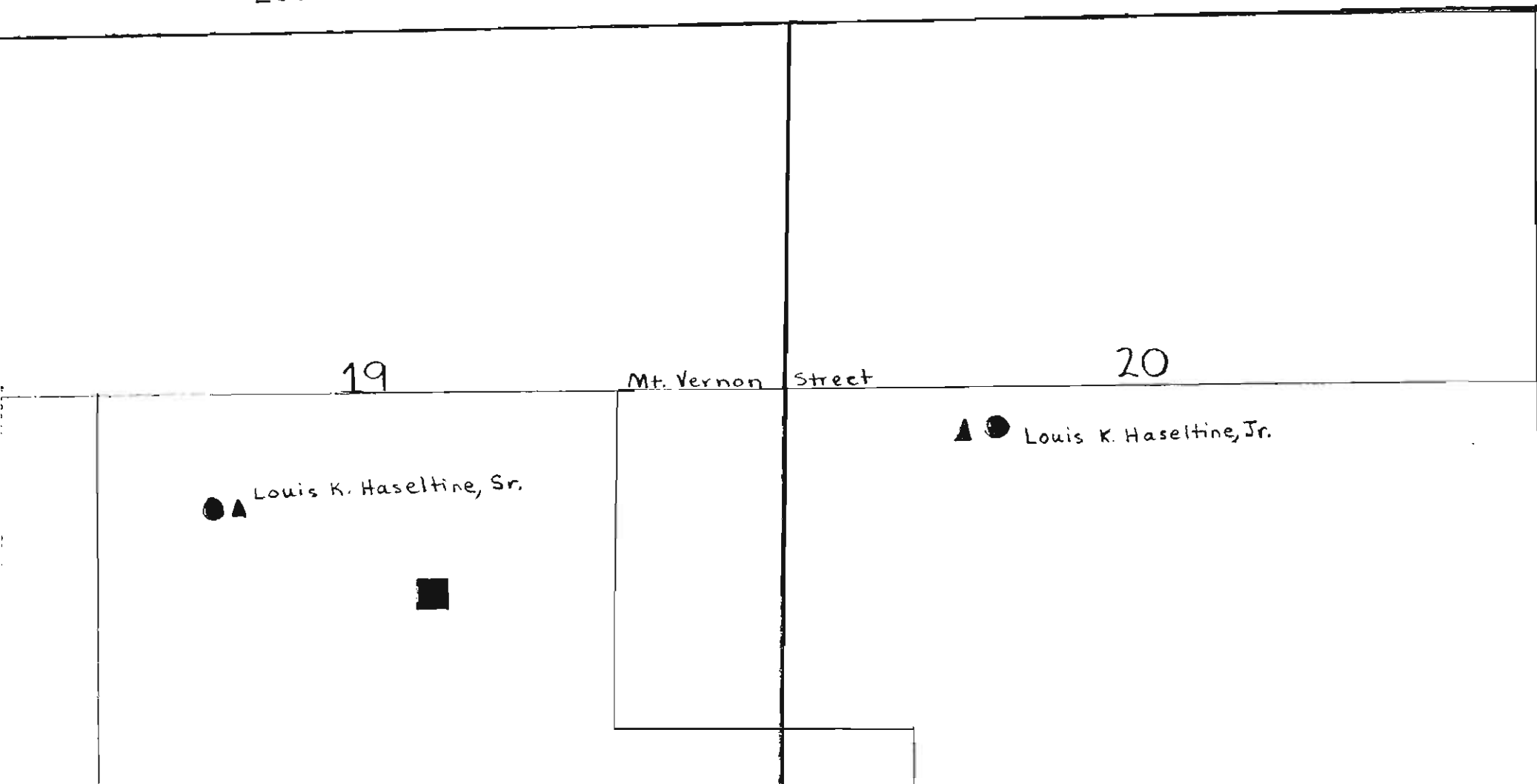
The house is built of concrete block. Though a plain material, it was sturdy, thrifty, and enjoyed a popularity around the turn of the century as a material for fashionable middle-class dwellings. It is handled with some style in the Louis Kossuth Sr. house: a string course at the second floor level, and seven decorated and decorative pillars to support the large porch (now gone).

The main block is American Four Square, with a symmetrical facade. The interior is absolutely plain and unadorned. There is no central hall, no stylish staircase, no interest in symmetry or decor. It is a simple farm house interior.

Ancillary structure: A few feet east of the house is a water tower of rusticated rubblestone construction. It is one of four such extant masonry water towers next to historic Haseltine dwellings. The tank, which sat atop the tower is gone. Why the tower is stone rather than concrete block like the house has not been ascertained.

2.X. The barn had a ground floor and two wooden floors above, like the Spurzheim barn. The walls are full double construction with ca. six inch air space between. They are rubblestones laid up in forms, giving the very rough walls an entirely smooth plane at their outer surface, and square, straight corners.



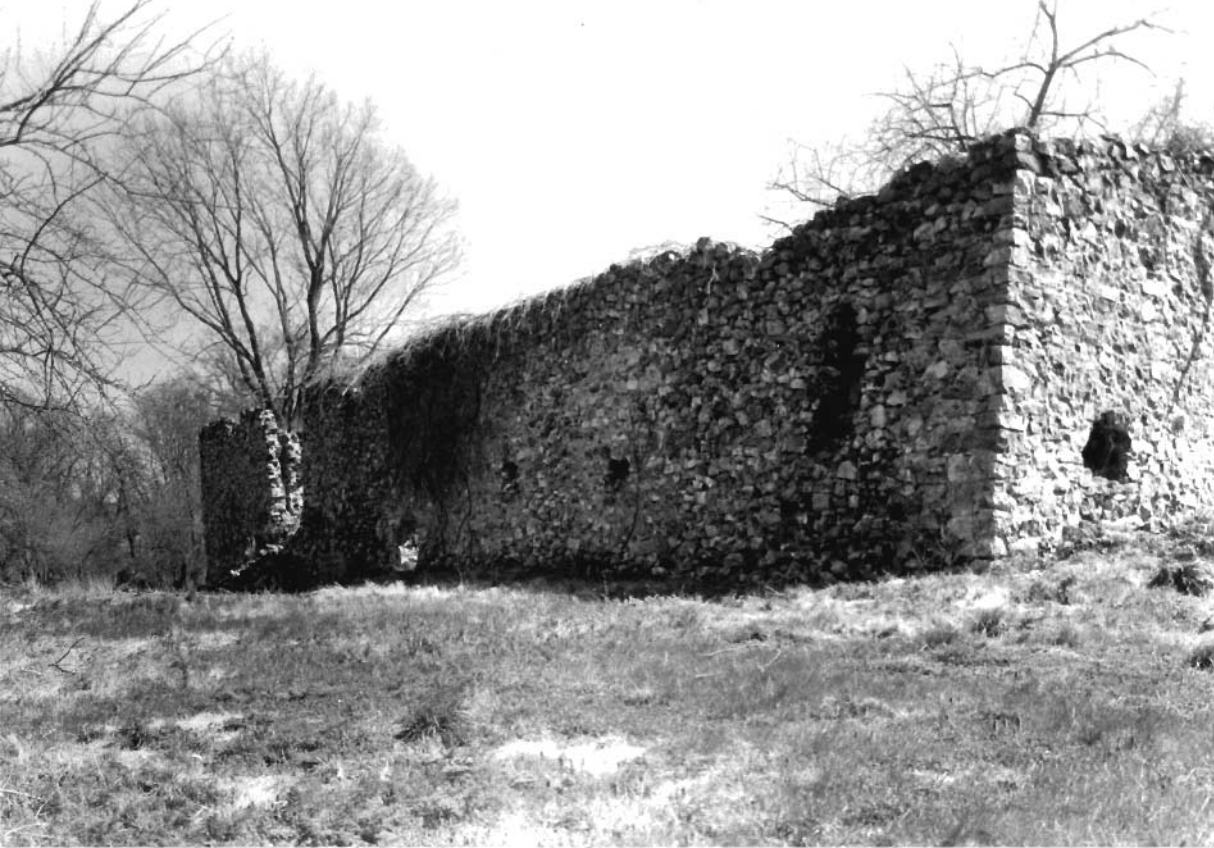

T. This house is significant in the context of the several masonry houses along and adjacent to Haseltine Road built by or for members of the Haseltine family.

The Louis Kossuth Haseltine Jr. house is located approximately one mile east of the Kossuth Sr. house, and fronts on the south side of Mt. Vernon Street. It was apparently surrounded by orchards on all sides, which extended west beyond Haseltine Road and east at least another half-mile.

The house is rusticated limestone laid in ashlar. Its formal central bay porch and side-lighted front door have a 1910's to 1920's look about them. Compared to Uncle Alfred's house at Haseltine Station, it is the same three-bay configuration but with refinements that might be expected in the third generation of such a family as the Haseltines.

The original second story of this house burned at a date not yet ascertained. The remodeling yielded the house seen in the present photos.

Ancillary structure: Across the driveway to the west is a rusticated stone water tower. It is one of four such water towers associated with historic Haseltine dwellings.

2.X. The second floor of the Kossuth Jr. house burned. The remodeling resulted in the house seen in the present photos.

T. This structure is significant in the context of the Haseltine family commercial apple business in approximately the last thirty years of the nineteenth century and the first thirty years of the twentieth century. It is one of six known Haseltine stone apple barns, the remains of five of which are extant.

The Spurgheim Haseltine barn is the only one of the five barns which has not burned. Its interior is significant therefore as a guide to the probable interior arrangements of the other barns, especially the two whose walls suggests a strong design similarity to this one. Unlike the others, its walls are formed concrete. However, the quantity of stone aggregate is so great in relation to the cement, and the size of many pieces so large, as to give at first an impression of the wall being stone laid in mortar. No reinforcing was used, making the tall, heavy slabs unstable when bereft of their interior timber bracing as they are now coming to be. They are, and were, especially vulnerable to water damage.

Spurgheim's barn is also the only one for which prima facie evidence exists of its spatial relation to the orchard it served (see 1930's and 1953 aerial survey photos).

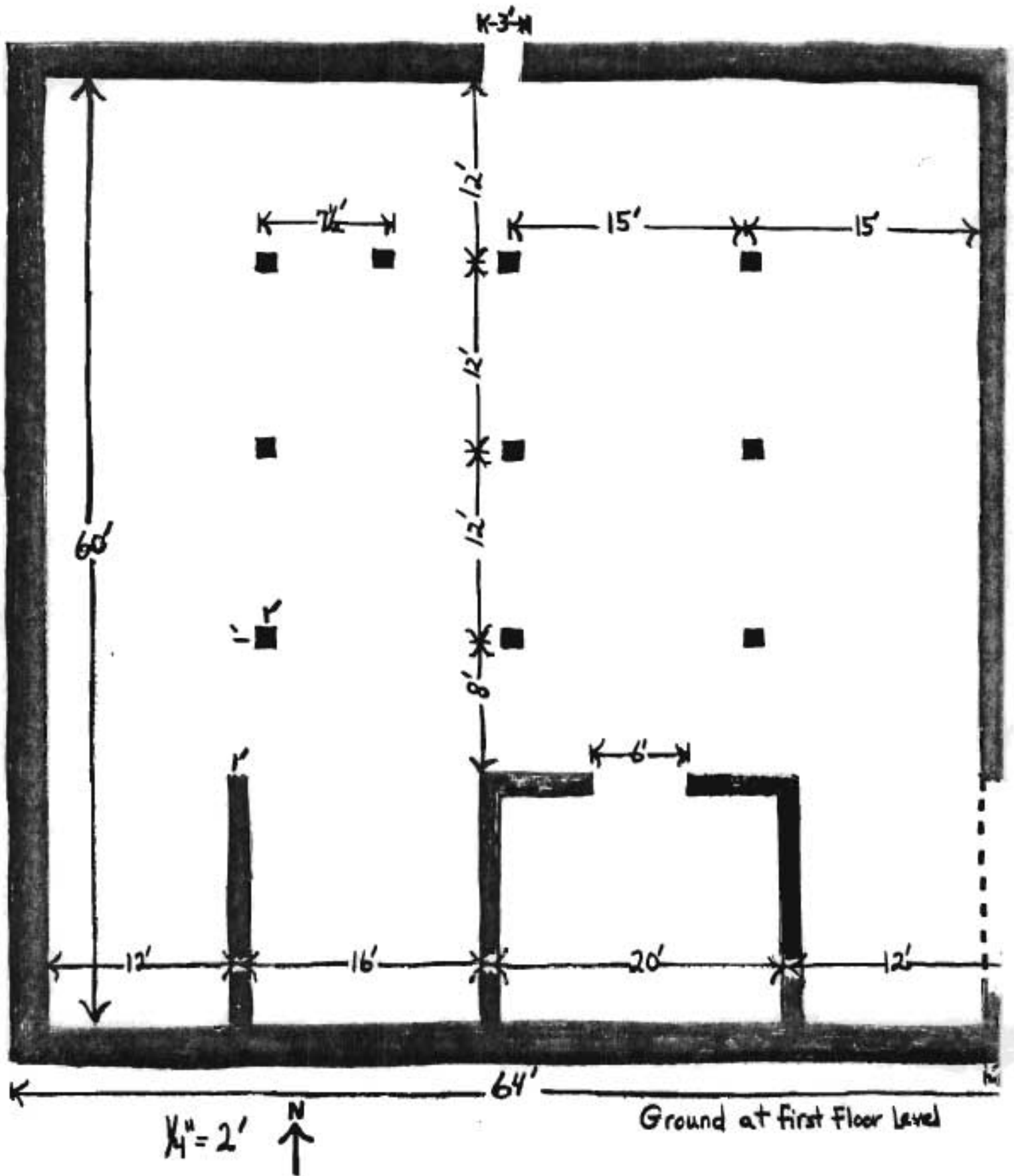
Ancillary structures and features: In addition to the associated cider shed (which see), these include: tenant house site (structure not extant); jonquil bed; sunken tank; and earthen loading ramp.

2.X. The barn fell into disuse probably in the 1940's (if not earlier) and has been abandoned at least since the airport purchased the site after World War II. The clearing of a corner of the orchard, which was in the path of a runway approach, is apparent on the 1953 aerial photo.

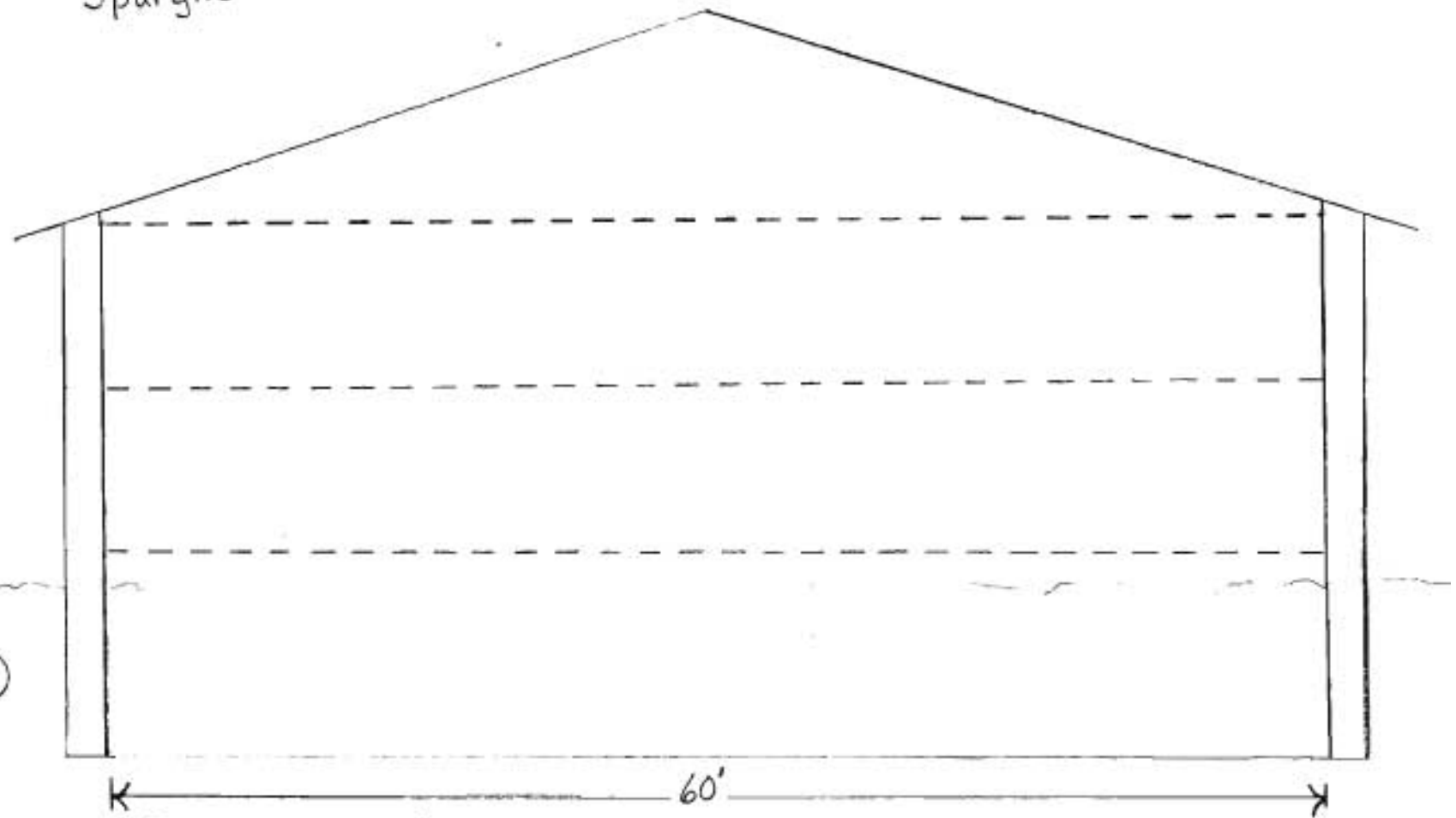
The unreinforced, cement-and-stone aggregate walls are in an advanced state of decay, though they still support a roof which itself is in an advanced state of deterioration.

The probable extension in the next few years of airport runways assures the ultimate razing of this barn and a clearing of the site.

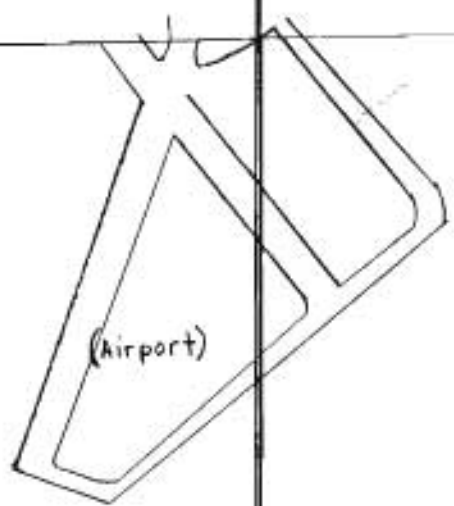

T. This Four Square concrete block house was the dwelling for the Patten family, resident tenants at Clover Dell Farm. It features two ranges of block, a stone-faced one in the foundation and first floor level, and a plain one at the second floor level. Full porches extend across front and back. The latter was screened, and used for serving crew meals during picking season. The building is crowned with a bellcast pyramid roof, from the apex of which a chimney protrudes. This chimney served not only stoves but a fireplace in the front room of the first floor. The second floor served as a crew dormitory during the picking season. A tank, supported on a tall metal frame, was just across the lane east of the house. Now down in ruins, it might have been either a water or a fuel tank.

ancillary structures: These include a storm-fruit cellar and a presumed smoke house, the latter burned. Both are concrete construction.

2.X. The house is today a shell. It fronts on County Road #150, Old Sunshine Road, which was a principal road into west Springfield at the time the farm flourished. At the east of the house is the lane up to the Kirk Graber Haseltine house at the top of the hill (see photo). Behind the house on a terrace of the slope is apple barn #2, now in ruins.
